Dear Ms. Browne,

Thank you very much for agreeing to tell the story of your own "passionate connections" in the arts as a prominent artist in our community. The Passionate Connections conference is the third bi-annual conference sponsored by the Alliance for Arts Education in Manitoba. The AAEM is an umbrella organization made up of artists, teachers, administrators and arts organizations who share the belief that "a strong and healthy society cherishes and sustains its artistic culture, and that a rich education in and through the arts should be part of every Manitoba child's development." Our goal is to raise the awareness of the importance of the arts with government, the general public, schools and decision makers.

This year's conference is a focus on the many arts activities in our schools that inspire passion and create connections for students and teachers.
